

The Rite Journey Calling & Departure Ceremony- Friday 31st January (Re-scheduled Date)

Nazareth invites you to take part in your child's rescheduled Calling and Departure Ceremony as they begin their rite of passage. Please be aware that participation in this ceremony is compulsory for all Year 9 students.

On Friday 31st of January, all Year 9s and their families make their way to Harold and Cynthia Anderson Reserve, corner of Seaview Road and Burbridge Road, West Beach at 5:45am for a 6:00am start for the official Calling and Departure Ceremony, which signifies the beginning of their year-long journey.

Upon conclusion of the ceremony, students walk together with their families and teachers along the River Torrens to the College for a shared breakfast. Parents are encouraged to dress in attire suitable for the walk. Please note that students are asked to wear their PE uniform with college hat and bring a drink bottle and use sunscreen where applicable. We anticipate the students will return to the College by approximately 8:00am for breakfast, concluding by 9:30am. As this is an early start for these students, dismissal for the day will be at the conclusion of the breakfast, with all Year 9 students expected to be offsite by 10:00am. Parent/Carer's Role

In reply, you are invited to participate in this reflection process by way of writing a letter to your child expressing your gratitude to them. The letter is an opportunity for you to share your favourite memories of your child and what you appreciate about them. Please bring this letter with you to the Calling and Departure Ceremony as you will have an opportunity to personally present it to your child at the ceremony.
